

SPIDER TREATMENT

Prior to our arrival and treatment:

-If we will be spraying on the interior:-

To do the best job we can, we need as much access as possible to areas that spiders can nest or to areas they travel. The better and more thorough your preparation, the fewer spiders you will see after our service.

Please clear the base of **all** walls of small items, books, shoes, toys, etc...-anything that shouldn't be sprayed and can be easily moved.

If you want your closets sprayed, moved stored items on the bottom (we don't want to spray your shoes). If you want under your bed sprayed—clear out any items underneath. If you want the area under your sink sprayed, it needs to be cleared out.

If you want the upper corners and the edges of your ceiling sprayed, cover things that should not be exposed to spray drift—high gloss furniture such as pianos, expensive TV's or stereos, and fish tanks.

In kitchens and bathrooms, either cover food items, food prep areas, and tooth brushes. Leave us note to spray these areas anyway and that you will clean, or understand that we will not spray up high to avoid contaminating these areas.

In bedrooms of infants, children under 6 months, nursing, or pregnant mothers—consider not spraying. If spraying must be done: Move all bedding, clothes, toys, etc., into the crib or onto the bed and cover with a sheet which can be washed after our service. We recommend longer vacate times for anyone matching this description—up to 48 hours.

-On the exterior:-

If we will be spraying on the outside: please pick up dog and kid toys, pet food dishes, etc..., from anywhere near our treatment area. Cover vegetable gardens if they are planted against the home.

For long term help, consider trimming back any tree limbs, bushes, or heavy vegetation against the exterior of your home.

During the treatment:

Please make sure that all people and pets area ready to vacate when we arrive, or are gone prior to our arrival. Plan on being out for 4 hours or longer.

After the treatment:

Please be patient, our control materials are not only the best available control materials for spiders they are also highly repellent to spiders. This can make them agitated. You will probably see more spiders right after a treatment plan before.

Do not, at any time, spray any other pesticide in your house. This is a safety issue as well as a control issue.

A preventative exterior treatment program on a regular basis (such as quarterly) should be considered to keep spider populations under control. Only the exterior needs to be treated on most visits except perhaps in the fall during spiders mating season.

100% control of spiders is not practical. The very best control materials for spiders are no longer labeled for indoor use. We cannot spray everywhere spiders can go. Spiders do not tend to walk back and forth over surfaces as much as insects. Spiders are much bigger than insects and it takes more contact with our control materials to eliminate a larger pest.
